

Securing financial aid and understanding FAFSA

☐ The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is used by national, state, and local government agencies, as well as higher education institutions and private organizations to award need-based financial aid.

The FAFSA calculates your eligibility based on financial need with respect to your estimated cost of attendance and family contribution.

The FAFSA opens up on October 1st each year, and forms should be completed within the first two weeks of October. There is no limit to the number of colleges to which you can submit the FAFSA.

Applying for merit-based and outside scholarship opportunities:
